March was an incredible month for Save a Generation here in Nicaragua. As I mentioned in my last newsletter, my brother brought a team of 23 people from South Florida, North Carolina, and South Carolina. The team completed the sponsor updates in 5 villages. Ken, my brother, bought a gas grill and he and his team cooked over 1,100 hot dogs for the people of each village. It was amazing watching each of the villages have the opportunity to eat a hot dog for the first time in their lives. While here the team also painted the churches and feeding stations in 3 of the villages. A fresh coat of paint for a fresh start of 2010!

During the month of March Save A Generation was blessed by a large donation that allowed us to buy flip flops, laundry soap, bath soap, and shampoo for the whole village of Pascuala. Every person in the village received a pair of flip flops and each family received 16 bars of soap, a bottle of shampoo, and enough laundry soap to wash clothes for 2 weeks. While on their mission, Ken's team was able to help deliver these much needed items. It was a blessing!!!
