This video reveals some brief history of Nicaragua and SAG. It also captures the intense need of the people and shows that there are so many projects to be done in the future. We remain a strong and growing organization, and our prayer is that this documentary brings SAG more partners and opportunities. Save a Generation has been renovating a building in Managua to meet MINSA (Nicaraguan Health Department) standards to become a full time clinic. This project is almost complete and expected to be open in June. It is important to get the Managua clinic open for many reasons. It will be an affordable place for all to seek medical care and no one will be turned away. The plan for the Managua clinic is for the profits to be used to support and maintain Save A Generation's clinic in Somotillo.

During the month of May, our on staff doctor had held a grand opening of a pharmacy directly next door to the Managua clinic. Having this pharmacy will allow Save A Generation and medical teams to purchase medicine at a lower rate. A great blessing!

More great news in Nicaragua -

Save A Generation has always delivered food to the Village of Santa Cruz for the villagers to cook, but did not have a feeding program in the village. Save A Generation has partnered with the Foundation for Rural Communities, INC. and now has a 6 day per week feeding program in this village. There is now a cook to prepare meals and they are being served in the SAG church building.

Another exciting project that is underway is the 'Santa Cruz Cistern Project'. Save A Generation has been awarded a grant from Foundation for Rural Communities, Inc to build a cistern in the village of Santa Cruz. This grant will allow SAG to replace approximately 5 miles of one inch pipe with new two inch piping. SAG will be constructing a 12 X 12 X 12 foot cistern to capture water which will then be pumped to a water tower in the village. For a village with no water, this cistern project will change their lives and is a true blessing from the Lord. We pray that in the future this cistern will allow Santa Cruz to start raising live stock and grow crops in this village.

I again want to invite you to come to Nicaragua and be a part of Save A Generation. Mission trips are planned through out the year if you would like to join a team. It is not too late to join the team coming July 15 - 20, 2010. You are also welcome to organize your own team.
